He said effective today, Zainal Rahim will take over from Tan Sri Mohamad Zabidi Zainal who held the post since March 15, 2013. Zabidi retired on December 31, last year.

"He (Zainal Rahim) has served in the public service sector for more than 33 years with wide experiences in various fields including human resources management as well as land and district management," said Ali in a statement.

Before this, Zainal, 59, was the Malaysian Administrative Modernisation and Management Planning Unit (Mampu) director-general which he held since Jan 9, 2015.
