

Edu Ministry activates op centre to ensure smooth SPM in flood-hit Kelantan, Terengganu

KUALA LUMPUR: The Education Ministry has activated its operation centre to ensure floods which has struck Terengganu and Kelantan will not affect the Sijil Pelajaran Malaysia (SPM) examination.

Its Senior Minister Datuk Dr Mohd Radzi Jidin said the Malaysian Examination Board will also take the necessary steps to manage examination centres affected by the flooding in both the east coast states.

"I take note of the flooding in Terengganu and Kelantan which also affected a number of examination centres for the SPM exams at the two states.

"The ministry has activated our flood operation room and the Examination Board is also taking the necessary actions to manage the affected examination centres.

"Let us pray that the floods will not prolong and students of the 2021 cohort who will be sitting for the examination could prepare and safely sit for the exam," said Radzi in a posting on his official Facebook today.

The posting was accompanied by several pictures of several schools including SK Rantau Panjang in Kelantan inundated by floodwaters.

The continuous downpour which lasted until this morning inundated the two East Coast states.

As of noon today, more than 4,000 people in Terengganu have been evacuated and placed at 91 relief centres activated across the state.

In Kelantan, almost 4,000 people from five districts have been evacuated to 36 relief centres.
