

Government agrees to approve four projects for Kelantan [NSTTV]

TUMPAT: Prime Minister Datuk Seri Ismail Sabri Yaakob said the government has agreed to approve four projects for Kelantan during the East Coast Economic Region Development Council (ECERDC) meeting today.

The meeting was held at the Darulnaim Complex in Kota Baru.

The projects are the border town development; East Coast Expressway Phase 3 (LPT3) project; extension of the Kuantan - Segamat highway project involving routes from Runchang to Simpang 3 Keratong covering 51km; and the Rantau Panjang - Golok Phase 2 flood mitigation project costing about RM897 million.

"During the meeting today, the government agreed for the border town development project which includes a bridge connecting Rantau Panjang to Sungai Golok and the Takbai bridge which connects Pengkalan Kubor to Takbai.

"This shows the federal government is fair to all state governments," he said at the launch of the Kampung Laut Heritage Village here today.

Ismail Sabri said the LPT3 project would cover about 147km involving Gemuruh in Terengganu to Pengkalan Kubor, Kelantan.

On the flood mitigation project, Ismail Sabri said he was informed that about 60 percent of Phase One of the project had been completed.

He hoped the project would solve flood-related problems in Rantau Panjang and surrounding areas.
