

PM, cabinet ministers attend working retreat programme in Putrajaya

PUTRAJAYA: The federal cabinet ministers' working retreat programme today had, among others, focused on strengthening cooperation and unity among the ministers.

The Prime Minister's Department, in a statement today, said the programme, held at Kompleks Seri Perdana, was attended by Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim, 27 other cabinet ministers as well as 10 senior government officers.

"The programme was held to strengthen and fine-tune cooperation and unity among federal cabinet ministers in the unity government."

It said in line with the prime minister's wish to realise the realignment and reform agenda in the federal administration, the retreat programme featured special briefing sessions on key aspects of strengthening service delivery and ethics as well as administration of the government machinery.

"These aspects covered subjects such as Government Structure and Public Administration, Financial Management and Government Acquisitions.

"Also included were International Assemblies and National Interest, Government Protocol and Professionalism, Holistic Development, Economic Scenarios and Challenges as well as a briefing on Media Communications," read the statement.

Chief Secretary to the Government Tan Sri Mohd Zuki Ali also delivered a briefing on the ministers' Key Performance Indicators (KPI) during the retreat.

It is understood that the session began at 8.30am and ended at 4.30pm.

Meanwhile, Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Ahmad Zahid Hamidi, in a social media posting, said the retreat programme was also held to discuss the direction of the unity government.

"Apart from discussing the direction, the ministers also worked on the setting of KPIs for each ministry," he said.
